Groups

We're very fortunate to have started some new groups in the last few months – Cycling, Birdwatching, Walking and the possibility of an Association Croquet group in Nailsea in the Spring, maybe Backgammon and a Discovering Villages group which will cover the local area. All our current groups are listed on the website; just select 'Groups' from the menu bar and follow the instructions to see more detail, some photos and to have access to sending an email to the group leader if you want to join or just make further enquiries. Each group states whether they are open to new members or are full but maintaining a waiting list. We keep this information as up to date as possible, but numbers can change overnight, so do get in touch with a leader for the most up to date vacancy information.

In a change from our previous procedure the only way to initially contact a leader is via email on the website. Their email addresses are not published for the sake of privacy.

We have a selection of updates about current groups:

Astronomy Groups

We have vacancies in both Portishead and Nailsea for budding Astronomers and for the sky curious! If you are interested in seeing stars and hearing about stars, U3A Astronomy is for you. No question is out of bounds.

We look at the sun and stars in Australia at our monthly meetings (weather permitting). We are going as a small group to the Planetarium at 'We the Curious' in Bristol in December and will be planning more trips in the future.

Backgammon

Birdwatching

Our inaugural meeting:

The weather forecast was correct. It said that the rain would stop at about 9:30, and it did. 6 people amassed, if that's the right word, on the Esplanade. Some were experienced and some brand new, so after taking the register, I showed them how to 'personalise' their binoculars, some did not know about the dioptre!

The tide was high so no shore birds, so we looked over the lake and identified many birds. We noted that there were only 2 Canada Geese, they flew in later, about 40. Onwards we walked along the prom and up the steps to Battery Point. Because the wind was howling there was nothing on the coast, so we continued in to Eastwood. Very soon we were greeted by 20+ tits, brilliant to see the winter flocks of 4 species. Whilst I was speaking to my birders a female Buzzard flew above us. That was the only raptor seen. Halfway in we had superb views of a juvenile jay, such bright colours. At the end of Eastwood is the Royal Inn where we had a well-deserved coffee/ mulled wine. We returned along the road and after 3 hours we completed our first trip in the dry. We counted 25 species in the thoroughly enjoyable trip.
